Human Kindness Lesson

High School (9-12)

5-8 sessions 40 minutes

Emotional Learning (SEL)

Objectives

Students will identify examples of compassion, kindness, and empathy.

Students will recall an instance when they or someone they know expressed these emotions.

Students will create a mixed media artwork using text, symbolism, and image that visually represents their narrative.

Students will write a personal narrative describing this moment.

Materials

- Computer with Internet access
- Variety of assorted papers
- Adhesive
- Choice of: acrylic paint, tempera paint, markers

- Drawing paper
- Illustration board

Procedure

- Students will read the "Human Kindness Story" and virtually tour the POP Up museum located in Norwich, Great Britain.
- Students will listen to the short narratives that correlate to the selected pieces of art.
- Class discussion centers around which stories resonated the most.
- Students will then recall a personal story of kindness, empathy or compassion.
- Students will create a mixed media artwork.
- Students will write a personal narrative (paragraph) describing the story.
