

Interdependence Day History

Interdependence Day was launched in Philadelphia on **September 12, 2003** as a post 9/11 symbol of regeneration, as a time to reflect on the tragedy of the incidents of terror in the US and worldwide, and to ask, "What Next?"

It seemed critically important to acknowledge the inevitability and significance of interdependence in our time, and set out to build constructively, and civilly, and culturally, a global civil society.






